Sailboat Church: Chapter 2 "The Sailing Life"

In real life, no congregation will function like a rowboat or a Sailboat all the time. Most churches will experience a mixture of sailing and rowing. But if God is calling us to do more sailing than rowing, then it is important to be able to recognize what this might look like in church life.

Sailboat churches experience church as a divine-human partnership. In the Sailboat church, God and believers work together as partners. In this partnership what we do is important; what God does is essential. Church sailors know that the essence of church is participating in a dynamic, interactive process with a living God.

Sailboat churches make nurturing relationship with Jesus Christ a top priority. Leaders in Sailboat congregations believe helping people grow as active Christ followers is the first priority. They keep Jesus at the center of the church's life and its mission.

Sailboat churches are Holy Spirit powered. Just as there is no sailing without the wind, so there is no church worthy of the name apart from the Holy Spirit.

Sailboat churches live by prayer. Prayer gives the Spirit "place and space" to work in our lives.

Sailboat churches are shaped and guided by interaction with Scripture. Sailboat congregations know that in order to engage in God's mission in the world they need to be formed by God's written word.

Sailboat churches require spiritual leaders. Spiritual leaders are people who help others to seek and do God's will. These spiritual leaders, both clergy and laity, know that any authority they bear is delegated to them by Jesus.

Sailboat churches take spiritual realities and resources seriously. In the Sailboat church, as people pray and act in faith, the Holy Spirit draws forth the resources necessary for them to do what God truly wants them to do. The God who calls is the God who provides.

Sailboat churches live to sail. Sailboat churches know that they exist to sail with the winds of the Spirit on the course that God has set out for them in the world. The members of these churches also understand that God has called each one of them into the sailing life.

Sailboat churches are places of transformation. In a Sailboat church, people grow out of the need to be the center of their own universe, becoming less self-centered and more God-centered.

Sailboat churches teach and practice discernment. Christian discernment is about sorting out God's voice from the others and making decisions based on the desire to be in the flow of God's will. It also involves a commitment to do God's will, whatever it may be.

Team observations and thoughts

So much of our world is operating under the rubric of "conforming to what makes us feel good."

We often hear people say, "We are serving God's people, but why don't they come sit in our pews?" We are to be working as hard as we do for the mission and ministry of the congregation, recognizing that even if we don't see the benefits, churches can be making good spiritual impacts.

The important thing is to be obedient in response to what God seems to be doing. As we do this, the way forward will be revealed.
