Sailboat Church: Chapter 3

"The Wind"

The Holy Spirit is a *who* instead of a *what*. Even though we use the image of the wind to talk about the Spirit, in reality the Holy Spirit is not an impersonal force of nature. The Spirit is as much a living, personal being as are Jesus and God the Creator.

Jesus and the Spirit. The Holy Spirit is the Spirit of Jesus. To be filled by this Spirit means that we will become more like Jesus. We will live as he did, doing God's work in the world, because we will be like him through his Spirit's presence in us. We cannot be effective disciples of Jesus without welcoming the Spirit who empowered Jesus' own ministry. Being filled with the Spirit is meant to be a constant, ongoing process for every Christian.

Community in Spirit. Without the Spirit moving and acting in power, the church devolves from the living body of Christ into a well-intentioned but generally impotent religious organization.

The Holy Spirit is the source of power for the believing community. The Spirit can:

- encourage us
- help us stay focused
- lead us into new patterns of behavior and new ways to make decisions
- do things differently
- discern where God is calling & how to make decisions based on that call
- support us; give us peace
- empower us to take risks of faith
- give us spiritual power
- show us God's way forward.

God's power changes things we cannot change and provides resources beyond what we have ourselves to do God's work. When every path seems blocked, the Spirit can show us God's way forward.

Team observations and thoughts

Experiences of the Spirit's presence and power:

- Feeling uncomfortable where we may fall short, feels like nudging because of our resistance or distractions.
- We look back and say "that was a tiny, little thing" but it led to significant changes or experiences.
- Even though it makes us uncomfortable, we need to embrace the Holy Spirit.
- In a setting with music or a separate gathering that we feel the Spirit's wholeness.
- Some of the best meetings are those, where someone says "Let's stop and pray", there is a feeling that the Holy Spirit is among us.
