#### Sailboat Church: Chapter 6 "The Making of Sailors"

Churches are made up of members, and in order for the church to sail with the wind of the Spirit, its members must be willing to be sailors. No matter how committed and excited the leaders are, if a critical mass of the Church's members do not identify as sailors and practice the moves of sailing, that congregation will probably end up rowing into the future.

**Trust Jesus:** The core purpose of the church is to partner with the Holy Trinity in the salvation and re-creation of the world. Faith and trust in Jesus are at the heart of the sailing church. Trusting Jesus also involves inviting him to take control of our lives. Jesus has called us into relationship with him, and this relationship is central to who we are.

**Become a Disciple:** In the 1st century, it was understood that the disciple was meant not only to learn what the rabbi knew but also to become like the rabbi. Jesus was one of these traveling rabbis. Discipleship is about identity with him and commitment to his way of life. The relationship that Jesus and disciples have is meant to be as intimate and life-giving as that between a vine and its branches.

Be Filled with the Spirit: One consequence of trusting Christ and abiding with him as a disciple is that the Holy Spirit takes up residence in us. Prayer for the Spirit to fill us and equip us for the day keeps us grounded in our dependence on God. It keeps us in relationship. This is what God wants above all else.

**Put on the Whole Armor of God:** The armor of God (Eph. 6:11) will not keep us from experiencing hardships. Instead we can trust that as we wear it, God's purposes for us cannot be defeated. Some spiritual practices can protect us:

- The first practice is that of keeping Jesus the way, the truth, and the life front and center in our lives.
- The second practice we are to put on as armor is the practice of right living. People should be able to see the light of Christ shine through our presence and our behavior every day. Prayer is the key.
- Third is the practice of faith. Faith means keeping our eye on God in the midst of all the things that would drive us to sin or despair. Faith is the practice of always turning toward God.
- A fourth practice that armors us is remembering that we have a God who saves.
- The fifth practice is appropriating the power of God's word for our lives and mission. Scripture is powerful. We must let Scripture work on us so that we are shaped into the people God means us to be.

#### Team observations and thoughts

- We are odd people, as far as the world is concerned.
- Often find the need to pray: Make me trust what happens to me, despite what happens to me.
- It is often hard to make the right choice pray to make it clear when I make the wrong one.
- Where is our limit? When do we know? Maturity in the world versus maturity in the Christian world? How do we navigate that?
- Hope that what we are saying and what we are reading can be translated to the members. Looking to form a "critical mass" of members who are seeking the Holy Spirit's guidance.
- Most churches will feel mixture of rowing and sailing. Others may not understand the goal. One real challenge: Within the congregation, take everything at face value, but there are times when we are just as literal when our mind is elsewhere.
- This is intended to be a heart process.
- Concerned that majority of the congregations thinks change is (too) difficult.
- We used to have a lot of people who gathered together. We need that connection again.
- You don't get off the hook to evangelize others. Reading this book makes you realize that!
- We are going to have to be very clear about what we are and who we are.
