Sailboat Church: Chapter 7 "From Rowboat to Sailboat: Raising the Sails"

By God's grace any church can sail, and any Christian can learn to be a sailor. What follows are some of the postures and practices that act as spiritual sails.

Prayer, the Mainsail. God has chosen prayer as the main way God's power flows from heaven to earth. We do not give God orders; rather we hold hands out to receive what God wants to do in and through us.

Obedience. The bottom line is that God is meant to lead and we are meant to follow in this thing we call church. When God is in control, we will usually find ourselves sailing.

Discernment. God is very willing to guide us if we are willing to be guided. This willingness requires us to slow down, have the inner intention to seek God's will, learn to be sensitive to signs of God's activity and calling in the world, and develop some facility in listening to God's voice in Scripture, circumstances, and community.

Sacrifice. If we want the Spirit of God to be the prime mover in our church, there are some things that will have to go:

- The Need for Control.
- The Need to be Comfortable.

Trust God's Provision. The Christian life was never meant to be something that we do ourselves. God desires to have a deep and intimate partnership with us in blessing the whole world. The deeper we allow God to go with us, the more we will experience God's guidance and provision in every area of our lives. Prayer is the means by which this process goes forward. Prayer opens the door for God's grace and provision to flow into our lives, into the church, and into the world.

Expectant Gathering. Whenever believers meet, we can expect the Spirit of Jesus to meet us and to work in us and through us. God invites us into fellowship of the covenant community to be transformed and empowered.

Thanksgiving and Testimony. When the wind of the Spirit begins to blow and the church begins to sail, it is important to give God the glory. Jesus told us not to hide our lights under a bushel basket, but to let them shine so that all might see. Testimony is one of the ways we do this to the glory of God.

The wind of the Spirit is blowing today just as much as when the first believers sailed out to make disciples of all nations. God has everything we need to be faithful in our mission and discipleship and is more than willing to give it to us as we humbly allow ourselves to be guided by the Holy Spirit. Raise the sails and cast off!

Team observations and thoughts

- There are times you need to row. There are times the wind may not blow. It is hard to be a sailboat church is more difficult to convert.
- By God's Grace, even the church can sail.
- We're to be looking to the possibility of sailing, despite the ones who do not want to let go.
- We can't row our way to sailing.
- Obedient part is hard to comprehend.
- Many folks in our congregation may not embrace this sailboat church.
- To do something different is a challenge. To place our trust in someone other than ourselves is uncomfortable.
- Nobody is comfortable with discomfort, but if everyone is comfortable, we're doing something wrong.
- Are we willing to risk and fail?
