sets us free to accept ourselves and to love God and neighbor,


and binds us together in the one body of Christ, the Church.

Sailboat Church: Chapter 9 "Preparing for Storms"

While we may have little control over the storms of life, we can prepare for them well before they hit. The goal is to react to problems and conflicts in healthy ways. Four important areas where groundwork can be done are:

- Strengthening the Church's Practice of Prayer. Part of building a strong prayer foundation under the church is training believers to expect answers to prayer, recognize them when they come, and give thanks to God for them.
- **Developing a Strong Leadership Team**. Making decisions through the process of communal discernment when appropriate, rather than only discussion and voting, gives officers a chance to practice working together as a team. Practicing these things in ordinary times helps us perform better when trouble strikes.
- Preparing for Conflict.
 - Keep Communication Open.
 - Practice Honesty, Humility, and Forgiveness as Core Values.

Healthy churches recognize and name problems before the atmosphere around them becomes too emotional or personalized. They claim the presence and gifts of the Spirit to face them openly, honestly, and prayerfully. This way of dealing with conflict brings glory to God and adds to the health of the church and its effectiveness for mission.

Team observations and thoughts

- If we were all Christ-like, maybe wouldn't be any conflict in churches.
- New Testament churches were full it.
- Is there a difference between conflict and disagreement? It feels as though conflict is more severe. Perhaps we have higher expectations in church.
- Conflict interferes with ability to worship in church.
- Many people come in and out may not notice conflict, until they become more involved.
- It's important to know how the congregation has handled conflict in the past.
- There is an issue that still has residual resentment associated with it.
- Sometimes we have to recognize that there are situations where full communication about an issue cannot appropriately be communicated. Importance of trust among and in leaders.
