The Church Responds in Faith

Affirmation of Faith

Adapted from the Confession of 1967

In Jesus Christ, God was reconciling the world to Godself. Jesus Christ is God with humankind. He is the eternal Son of the Father, who became human and lived among us to fulfill the work of reconciliation. He is present in the church by the power of the Holy Spirit to continue and complete his mission. This work of God, the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, is the foundation of all confessional statements about God, humankind, and the world.

In Jesus of Nazareth, true humanity was realized once for all. Many rejected him and demanded his death. In giving himself freely for them, he took upon himself the judgment under which all people stand convicted. God raised him from the dead, vindicating him as Messiah and Lord.

The risen Christ is the Savior for all people and the judge of all people. The reconciling work of Jesus was the supreme crisis in the life of humankind. His cross and resurrection become personal crisis and present hope for people when the gospel is proclaimed and believed. In this experience, the Spirit brings God's forgiveness to people, moves them to respond in faith, repentance, and obedience, and initiates new life in Christ.

The new life takes shape in a community in which people know that God loves and accepts them in spite of what they are. To be reconciled to God is to be sent into the world as his reconciling community.

Using Jesus' harvest imagery in John 4:35–38 and Matthew 9:37–38/Luke 10:2, this urgent text sounds a compelling call to Christian service. The words gain energy from the strong unison tune in the English cathedral style, whose name echoes the Benedictine motto "Prayer is work."
